Fire Inspections- Still working on Selmet inspections. Site plan reviews done for Performance Systems Integrations, two access and water supply reviews for residential homes. Diego is working on ESO inspection program updates.

Equipment- E-71 had foam leak fixed, intake valve replaced, and radiator leak fixed, and tachometer replaced. Water 71 air brake line was replaced on the front driver side. WT-73 went out-of-service for a hydraulic issue. AMMCO will be looking at the tenders. Can not restrict the flow. The pump is a Berkley which is an irrigation pump. Retraining will need to be given on how to operate the tenders. We will work through the issue.

Training- Fire Certifications received: Briggs-Firefighter 1, NFPA Driver and NFPA Hazmat; Amanda-Firefighter 1, and NFPA Hazmat; Eric NFPA Driver. Worked on getting the new

SCBA's in service. Our new recruits have finished Firefighter 1 Academy. We are in the planning phase of doing a Spring Academy (3 new students). Chapin programmed all of the radios to each individual pack. It is clearer and much easier to use. Training on the new packs, and everyone seems to like them.
